
## Installation

- Above screen you will find on the left side the micro-SD and nano-SIM cards slot. Use the card removal tool and insert it into the hole. The tray will be ejected slightly.
- 2. Once the tray is fully pulled out, turn it over to put the cards in their place as shown in the image. Turn the tray over again and return it with the cards to their place, making sure that it is fully inserted.
- The base is on the back of device, use the cleft at the bottom and move it to the most comfortable position for each situation.
- 4. Connect the curled handset cord into the device base. Connect power supply cable to the connector on the side of the device and then plug power supply into a household AC power outlet.
- 5. If you want to remove the Tablet from its position, you have to unlock the two screws on the back that are indicated in the image. Insert the hex key and turn both screws counterclockwise six turns. Then pull of the Tablet across the top side until it is removed. If you want to place the Tablet on the base, place it in position properly, and then use the hex key to turn each screw six turns clockwise.









# Precautions for use



This device complies with current regulations to limit the maximum output volume. Using headphones at very high volume may cause hearing damage.

#### Care and maintenance

- Listening to a music player at a very high volume can damage the user's hearing and cause hearing problems (temporary or permanent deafness, ringing in the ears, tinnitus, hyperacusis). Therefore, it is strongly recommended that you do not use the player at full volume or for more than one hour a day at medium volume.
- Keep the device away from children and pets. They could damage the device accidentally or choke on small parts. Do not drop or knock the device. Rough handling can damage electronic circuits.
- Keep the device dry and avoid liquids that could corrode the device. Do not use the device with wet hands, which may cause electric shock.
- Do not place the device in areas of excessive heat, which may shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, or melt accessories.
- Do not place the device in cold areas. When the device warms up to its normal operating temperature, moisture can accumulate inside the device, which may damage electronic circuits.
- Do not place the device in areas exposed to sunlight as it may cause overheating.
- Do not place the device near flammable liquids, gases or explosive substances.
- To clean the device, use a damp or antistatic cloth. Do not use a dry or static cloth. Do not use chemicals such as cleaning solvents to clean the surface of the device. Turn off your device before cleaning.
- Do not apply paint over the device, as it can prevent proper operation.
- The manufacturer's warranty does not cover repair the appliance if the device or battery gets wet, or device label is damaged even when the device warranty has not expired.
- Always make sure your device is turned off before removing your SIM card. This will prevent data loss and damage to the SIM card. Do not place the SIM card near surfaces or electromagnetic environments and avoid touching the metal connectors.

## Precautions for use

#### Measures that affect the safety of users

- Do not use the device in certain situations (while driving) and certain places (airplanes, hospitals, schools, gas stations and professional workshops).
- For mobile phones, remember the prohibition of using the device manually by the driver of a moving vehicle.
- Users of electronic implants (pacemakers, insulin pumps, neurostimulators, etc.) must
  take the following precautions: the distance between the device and the implant must
  be at least 15 cm; the position of the device, during the call, must be on the opposite
  side of the implant.

**Instructions for use to reduce the level of consumer exposure to radiation** (this advice is given as a simple precautionary measure, no danger associated with the use of a mobile phone has been observed)

- The use of the device in good reception conditions is recommended to reduce the amount of radiation received (especially in an underground car park, when traveling by train or car ...).
- Make reasonable use of radio equipment, such as mobile phones, by children and adolescents, for example, avoiding night-time communications and limiting the frequency and duration of calls.
- Indication of good reception parameters (for example: display on the device screen of four or five bars).
- It is recommended to use a hands-free kit and, in this situation, take the following
  precautions during a call: keep the device away from the stomach in pregnant women
  or the lower abdomen in adolescents.

# Precautions for use

#### **Battery use**

- The device battery is not removable. Do not try to remove the battery from the device as it may damage the device.
- Never use any charger if damaged. Do not short-circuit the device, as this may damage the battery or cause a fire.
- Do not subject the device to high temperatures or fire as it may explode.
- The charging time depends on the remaining battery charge and charger used. Use only original chargers and accessories approved by the manufacturer.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but its duration will gradually decrease. When the operation time is noticeably shorter than normal, contact the manufacturer.
- Disconnect the charger from the electrical plug and the device when the it is not in use. Do not overload your battery as it may damage or shorten its life.
- Do not expose the device to places of extremely hot or cold temperatures. as it will reduce the battery capacity. The Li-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below 0° C.

When the battery level is low, the device will issue a warning tone and a low battery message. Connect the power adapter into the device to start charging. Battery level is indicated on the screen during the charging process, and once it is fully charged, the battery icon will appear full. Charging a completely discharged battery may take more than 5 hours. Fully charge the battery before using the device for the first time.

### Main screen

Press the [0] button on the top of Tablet for 3 seconds to turn on your terminal. If this is the first time you start the device, setup wizard will be displayed. Enter the PIN code of your SIM card and press 0K to confirm. Then wizard will guide you through device setup process.

- Select languages: press to display available language list, select desired language for on-screen menus, and then press Next to continue.
- Date & time: choose Automatic date & time to use automatic date and time provided by the network, or manually set your device date & time.
- Connecting to Wi-Fi networks: select Mobile network or Wi-Fi to connect
  to Internet through your SIM card or also through Wi-Fi. Click on one available Wi-Fi
  networks and follow the steps to enter the password and save chosen network.
- Google Account set up: enter your Google account information or create a new one to access all device functions.

Once you turn on the device and complete setup process, main menu will be displayed:

From the main screen, drag up the bottom navigation bar up to access the applications menu.

# Application menu

Press on an application icon to access it, and use the 

✓ icon of the navigation bar to return to the previous menu.

You can also use the icon of the navigation bar to access all the applications that are working in the background and decide whether to access it again or to close it permanently. When using an application and if you would like to return to Main screen, press the or icon of navigation bar. The application will be closed but it will continue working in the background. A long press on this icon will take you directly to the Google search engine.





You have available all essential Google application as Google, Maps, Gmail, etc. In addition to other application for daily use as Clock, FM radio, etc. If you need an application that there isn't available, press on the Google Play icon to access Google Play.


#### Google Play

# Notifications and system menu

In the upper left corner of the screen are displayed notifications from different applications installed on your device, such as messages, email, missed calls, etc., while on the right is shown current status of the system elements as battery level, network connections, Wi-Fi. Bluetooth, etc.

Pull down notification area by sliding down top of the screen bar to access system menu.

You can expand more menu system function sliding this bar down.

Press on the proper icon to enable or disable Wi-Fi or Bluetooth connections, change audio profile, screen brightness, backlight time, etc.

# Callina

By holding, the icon will access configuration of the corresponding function in system settinas menu.

To turn off the device press  $[\Phi]$  button on the top of Tablet for 3 seconds, and select the option **Power off**. Use a short press on this same button to lock and unlock the screen.

#### Calling using the alphanumeric keypad

- 1. In standby mode, pick up the handset, enter phone number using alphanumeric keypad displayed on screen and press \( \screen\) icon to call.
- 2. To end the call, press the , icon or hang up the handset.

#### Calling in handsfree mode

- 1. In main screen press icon to access telephone application.
- 2. Enter phone number using the alphanumeric keypad and press \( \scirc\) icon to call.
- 3. Press [ 🕲 ] button to start handsfree mode. The 🕲 indicator will glow green, indicating that handsfree mode is active.

#### Answer or silence an incoming call

- 1. During an incoming call, drag right ( ) icon to answer the call or pick up the handset or press on the "Answer" option
- 2. Before the call is answered, you can mute incoming call ringtone by pressing the [ \infty] button
- 3. When the call is active, press the [ \ ] button to mute your microphone.

#### Transfer an incoming call

- 1. During an incoming call, pick up the handset or drag right ( ) icon to answer the call or press on the "Answer" option
- 2. Press on the ticon on the Vol -screen to start a second call to another phone number or contact from the phonebook.
- 3. When the second call is active, press 1 icon to transfer the incoming call to the second contact

# Calling

#### Adjusting handset volume

During an active call, press the [ ] buttons to decrease or increase respectively your headset of handsfree volume.

#### Three way calling

- 1. During an incoming call, pick up the handset or drag right ( icon to answer the call.
- Press on the ticon to hold active call and start a second call to another phone number or contact from the phonebook.
- **3.** When a second call is active, press on the  $\lambda$  icon to start multi conference.
- 4. Repeat operation to add up to 5 participants.

#### Configuring speed dial keys

- 1. In main screen press on one of not set speed dial icons M1-M9 to access speed dial menu, or press telephone icon to access call menu, then drag down the keypad and speed dial menu will be shown.
- Press one speed dial iconto associate e new contact. You can associate a phone number or a phonebook contact.
- 3. Press Add to confirm and complete the operation.
- When a speed dia key is already set, press 
  icon to edit it, or press 
  icon to
  delete.
- 5. In main screen menu press a speed dial icon M1-M9 to use speed dial function and call associated contact. The call will start automatically.
- 6. To end the call, press the 
  icon or hang up the handset.

#### Make a video call

- In applications menu, press on the icon to access Meet application (Also you can download other video call application).
- The phonebook contacts with Meet account will be displayed. Press on desired contact and then select Video call to start calling.

# Bluetooth® connection

The Bluetooth® function allows you to pair your terminal with other Bluetooth® devices or accessories, like headphones, or to exchange contacts or media files with other devices. Also you can use the terminal to answer received calls in other paired device, as a smartphone.

To enable Bluetooth® adapter, slide down system information bar to display system menu, and press on the 🗼 icon. If any previously paired device is within device range, it will automatically connect, and the \* icon will be displayed in the system notification bar.

#### Pairing to a Bluetooth device®

- 1. Hold down the icon in the system menu to access Bluetooth® settings, or access through system settings menu by pressing on the icon in application menu.
- 2. Within Connected device configuration menu, press Pair new device and all Bluetooth® devices visible within the range of the terminal will be displayed on the screen.
- 3. Press on the device you want to pair to your terminal and accept the pop-up menu is shown in both devices. Make sure that the temporary visibility of both devices is enabled

#### Importing Contacts via Bluetooth®

- 1. Once the devices are paired, access Contacts on your Smartphone and select Share or Export (depending on the Smartphone), select Share via Bluetooth®, and select the contacts you want to send.
- 2. A message will appear to confirm the file transfer. Select **Accept** to receive the file.
- 3. Once sent, the telephone will receive a file in vcf (or vcard) format, you can access it drag down the notification bar and pressing on the Bluetooth® notification. Then press on the received file and select the destination (SIM card, phone, online account, etc.)

# Wi-Fi connection

To enable Wi-Fi network adapter, slide down system information bar to display system menu, and press on the  $\bigcirc$  icon. If any Wi-Fi network previously configured is within the range of the device, it will automatically connect, and the  $\bigcirc$  icon will be displayed in the system notification bar.

#### Set up a Wi-Fi network connection

- **1.** Hold down the icon in the system menu to access Wi-Fi settings, or access through system settings menu by pressing on the icon in application menu.
- 2. Within Networks & Internet configuration menu, you can enable or disable Wi-Fi function. Also you can access Wi-Fi settings pressing Wi-Fi, if Wi-Fi network adapter is active, all networks within terminal range will be displayed.
- Press on the Wi-Fi network you want to connect, enter the password in the pop-up window, and press on Connect to save settings and connect to the network.
- 4. Within the Wi-Fi setup menu, press Wi-Fi Preferences to open Wi-Fi options menu.

#### **Activate Wi-Fi hotspot**

- **1.** Press icon in the application menu. Within **Networks & Internet** select **Hotspot & tethering** option.
- Then press Wi-Fi Hotspot and press on On/Off to enable or disable the fuction respectively
- 3. Within this menu you also can modify Hotspot name, Security or Hotspot password.

It is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves as recommended by international guidelines. Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) is the unit of measurement of the amount of radio absorbed when using mobile devices. SAR tests are performed in standard handling positions, with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level,


